School Update

As our school continues, we are seeing some great things happening. WE have several kids who had been labeled as "retarded" by the public school system and completely ignored because in their estimation, they can't learn. Well I can assure you, they are not aware that our God still works miracles today and with a stable, strict and systematic approach to education and operating in an environment where they are told "itu puedes!" (you can do it!) instead of constantly being told "tu no puedes" (you can't do it), great things can happen...like they are here. We have several kids who were illiterate teenagers but are now reading and working with simple math problems. Those of you who helped get the school off the ground and those who are continually helping support the school, we say a huge "THANK YOU!". You are truly helping to change the destiny of some of these young people.

Welcome Osiel

I want to introduce to you, one of our newest family members. This is Osiel. He is 10 years old, although he looks like he is about 8. He has come from a terrible background of abuse and neglect. DIF (Mexico's Child Protective Services) brought him to us about 2 months ago. This boy, along with his sisters, had physically suffered at the hands of their biological father. Oseil has a scar on the underside of his arm that stretched from his wrist all the way to just before his elbow. His father was drunk and cut Osiels' arm open with a knife.



These children were removed from that home and placed in an adoptive home. The adoptive parents finally demanded that DIF remove the children because they were extremely disobedient and destructive. They were then placed in one of the other orphanages ion the area and that placement broke down as well. The DIF agent told us that they had to separate the siblings because they were uncontrollable and our home was the last resort for Osiel. If he broke down with us, then he would be placed in the Juvenile Detention Center. I will admit, the first week or so, I thought we did indeed "have a tiger by the tail" but Anna reached out to him with a true mothers love and it, along with all the staff applying a consistent "tough love", he has made an amazing transformation. He has become a pleasure to be around and we have very few behavioral problems. When DIF returned to see if our home was still intact after what they originally described to us as if "hurricane Osiel" had landed upon us, they were astonished at what they saw. They simply could not believe that it was the same boy. They are now looking into bringing his sister here to be with him, which he is desperate for. So we are grateful to God for his grace and mercy and how it has totally changed this little boy!
