We can move forward with the purchase of our children's home! As of this writing we have received \$41,000 and have received commitments of \$3000 more...

WE ONLY NEED \$6000 MORE TO REACH OUR TARGET!

You may have received an email from us recently explaining why reaching our goal very quickly is so important right now. There are several reasons but the most exciting one is *the opportunity to have a group of professional builders from the U.S. build a complete 2nd floor on our home...* if we can finish raising the down payment before they are scheduled to arrive!

A minister from Del Rio that hosts groups coming across the border to do ministry projects came a few days before this writing to talk to us about a group of professional builders he is hosting in November. This group is a huge group...90+ men...that come to Acuna to build houses and churches in the space of 3 days. He said that he told them about our children's home and they want to know if there is something they can build for us. I showed him the roof leaks that have developed in the past few months. He said that the group actually prefers not to do repairs but rather build buildings. So I explained that in fact, we would rather build a second floor for houseparent's living quarters and bedroom space for boys (to separate the boys from the girls) then obviously that would fix our leak problem.

We're almost there!

The minister said that this project was a definite possibility as they have done several such projects in the past, and since the group leader specifically stated he wanted their group to do something special for us. So the group leader is coming on <u>October 12th</u> to identify and finalize their decision on which projects they will undertake and then the entire group comes in the middle of November to do the construction.

I told the minister we were in the process of raising the down payment and that was why we had not spent money on the leaks yet. Hearing that, he expressed his concern that the group would not take on a project unless the ministries they helped owned the property they were building on, which is certainly understandable. So before the group leader arrives on October 12th, if we are able to raise the balance of the down payment and can have a closing date that is scheduled before the construction team arrives in November, it is a very strong possibility that we will have a complete second floor added to the house without any cost to us...and built by experienced American builders. What a remarkable blessing!

So we are getting the word out about this HUGE bonus if we can finish raising the down payment before the group leader returns October 12th to make a decision on the projects they will tackle.

I believe this is a "God Thing". If you have been considering helping us finish raising the down payment, we ask that you consider how huge a blessing for us it will be if you can act quickly. Your giving could actually trigger the tremendous blessing of a completed 2nd story addition to our Children's Home!

School Days!

C chool is very important to us. We are > teaching the children the value of receiving an good education and while that has not completely sunk in to most of them yet, they do get excited about attending school. So on the first day of school, our home is quite a lively place as the excitement is almost overwhelming, especially for the little ones. Some have never attended school before, even though they are school age, but the schools have been understanding and give the kids grace for their lack of some basics. We have 4 children who attend a private Christian school and two of our kids have learning disabilities, so they are in special schools. We have to home school two of our kids. One is not allowed in the public school system due to the fact that he has never attended



school before coming to us, and he is now 14 years old. So there is no program for him. We have him enrolled in a type of adult education system that is done strictly at home so he has just passed his Kindergarten test and can read at an elementary level.



One of our girls, Mayte, is attending a type of trade school where she is learning how to sew and also to make piñatas. She is excited as she just sold her first piñata. This is something she can do to earn an income later when she leaves





our home and she now has more hope for the future. Hopefully Mayte's progress will be an encouragement to the others. *Now* she admits...education is a good thing!

Rosalba has been with us for over 3 years and Paula has lived with us for just over a year. We were so thankful to the people who helped us with all the different aspects of the celebration. The dresses were provided by Cathi Maris and Nadia Perez, both from Del Rio.

Providing these dresses was a special gesture from both Cathi & Nadia. Cathi was born in Romania. As a very young child, she lived in an orphanage until she was adopted by Pastor Terry & Dorcas of Del Rio. So Cathi, more than most, understands how special an event like this is in the life of a child in an orphanage. Nadia stated that she received so much joy out of wearing her dress that she wanted another girl to experience the same joy. We thank you girls for making our girls so

happy. It was amazing how the dresses fit these girls perfectly. Most of the accessories, the girls hair, nails, flowers and cakes were donated by some awesome folks. These girls come form terrible backgrounds of abuse and abandonment and for them to even think of having a Quinceanera celebration was just a dream. When they tried on their dresses, they knew that this was no dream...but was really happening. Their smiles didn't leave their faces for days...they were beyond ecstatic.

In the ceremony, it is customary for the girl to be escorted by their father, but these girls were blessed to be escorted by two amazing "padrinos"...Mike Kyle and Darin Dutcher. It was particularly special for Paula because Darin and his family met Paula several years ago when she was living in another casa hogar. They scheduled their trip from Missouri to coincide with the Quineneara so that they could honor Paula...and an honor it was! Another surprise for the girls was

that the Youth Group from Wade Baptist Church of Moss Point, MS came for their Summer visit just in time to celebrate with us, so the event was such a tremendous blessing for the girls...one they will remember and cherish for many years!





Healing Love

He is 2 years old but has many serious physical problems. When he first came to us, he could not stand to be touched. He wanted to be left alone in the playroom or in his crib. He wanted no interaction with any of the staff or kids. This photo shows how loving the little boy and girl are to Gilberto. These two kids have been through terrible things in their own lives and they are now experiencing God's love and healing and they just naturally show that love to Gilberto. Now Gilberto actually loves being "babied" ... a sign of the healing in his little heart.

fter over a year and a half living in our new home, we are seeing the necessity for some repairs & changes that we need to Address. Possibly there are groups that have experienced craftsmen who would like to help us with some of our pressing issues.

Here are a few of the projects:



Roof leaks. We are experiencing roof leaks, especially after this season's heavy rainfalls. Our house has the infamous flat roof that allows water to sit until the sun dries it out. We need to stop these leaks soon so the inside ceilings don't suffer too much more.

Painting: Some of the rooms still have wallpaper on them that are beginning to peel. As you may imagine, as soon as a child sees a loose strip of wallpaper, it isn't long before the temptation becomes overpowering to give it a little tug. Those little peels are now big strips so we need to strip the wallpaper and paint those remaining rooms.





Carpets: We REALLY need to pull out the carpets in three of the bedrooms. They are quite old, stained and smelly and were never attached very well to the floor so we want to pull them out then finish the floors with some of the new style concrete paint/stain. We believe this is the cheapest and strongest way of covering the floors.

Windows: Even though the house is better insulated than most other houses here in Acuna, it is still extremely hot inside during the day and on into the night even though the temperature outside is cooler than inside. Fans are really only moving hot air around so they don't help a whole lot. It is way too expensive to run the central AC units because we would have to run all three at the same time. The reason being, there is no way to isolate different zones in the house for the each of central units. So we want to open up many of the picture windows to allow for a lot more air flow from the outside. We want to replace the picture windows with either normal windows or Plexiglas doors in several cases where the windows stretch from floor to ceiling.





Intercom: The house has an antiquated intercom system and there are speakers in all the bedrooms. It does not work but if it did it would be a tremendous blessing for several reasons. This is obviously not a pressing issue or high priority but if someone who has experience with electronics was able to look at it, it might just be a very simple fix, and it would help the staff monitor the bedrooms from the kitchen (where the master unit is installed), we could communicate better with staff and children without having to yell, and we could have music playing throughout the house.
