Greetings in the Name of the Lord Jesus!


Summer has finally come to a close and school is back in session. Going to school is not just for the children but all the staff as well.







The public schools here are terribly lacking in so many areas. For example: one of our boys is in the 4th grade and had never been held back. Shortly after arriving at our home, we discovered that not only could he not read, he doesn't know how to count, he doesn't know the alphabet and he doesn't even know his colors! Anna has spent much quality time with him helping his with his basics and he is progressing very well so it tells us that the schools don't spend the necessary time and attention to the basics. We make sure that we do all we can to see that these children are educated. Without it, they have a very poor future in front of them and very little hope. We know that Jeremiah 29:11 says that God has a plan for each one of us and we want to instill that hope in our children.







Two of our little princesses, America (age 7) and Sugey (age 9), had birthdays in August. We had a party for them and they got to dress up like princesses. These two girls really light this home up and we are thankful to God for being able to share our lives with them.

Several weeks ago, a very professional looking group of people arrived at our gate at about 9:30 in the morning. We were not expecting anyone so this visit was a surprise. It turned into a very big surprise as we soon discovered that the highest ranking officers in DIF (the Mexican version of our Child Protective Services) of the State of Coahuila had arrived for a surprise inspection.

Many of you reading this will remember about three months ago we received a visit from the Fire and Safety Department. At that time we were told that we had many issues that needed to be corrected in the Home in order to comply with the newly implemented fire and safety codes. With the financial help of many folks we were able to get all those issues brought up to code in a timely manner.

However, this inspection was a much more serious inspection because these people from the state capital, Saltillo, had the ultimate authority over all children's homes in this state. The group consisted of the state head of DIF, the highest ranking DIF psychologist and the highest ranking DIF attorney. Anna and I managed to steal a brief moment in which to pray and invoke the favor of God upon us and our home.

They spent the entire day going through every detail of our home. They asked a multitude of questions. They interviewed each of our children in depth. They interviewed our staff ladies and administered a psychological exam to each of them. They went through all our files, our documentation and every little nook and cranny of the house itself. They did not finish their inspection until almost 4:30 so it was a very long day. We knew by the way in which the head lady spoke with us, that God had indeed caused us to have favor with these ladies. They commented on several things that we had in place that they had never seen before in any other homes. The head lady liked the way that we described our vision for the home...that of creating a family environment. At the end of their visit we had a meeting where they discussed their findings with us and they gave a few recommendations concerning additional documents they wanted to see in place. Finally, as we were walking the lady in charge through our office seeing her to the door, she stopped and said....

"congratulations...you have the best home in the State!"

WOW....Praise the Lord! We give all the glory to God for his grace and His mercy and we thank all the people who have helped make our home a model home. We still have so much that needs to be done in the home, but we are so thankful and humbled by the grace and the favor of God and the generosity of those who have shared their time, talents and finances to turn this old house into a home...a home that the top state officials said is the best.

Some require the expertise of certain building/construction trades and others can be handled by anyone. There is something for everyone!

- > Painting we have many places around the Home that need painting, both inside and outside
- > Secure outside stairs
- > Re-hang several doors
- > Tape & float & paint several unfinished walls
- > Build shelves in closets
- > Install burglar bars on new windows upstairs
- > Install kitchen plumbing & cabinets in cottage
- > Build closets/lockers in girl's room
- > Build large bathroom in girl'sbedroom
- > Install sink in laundry room
- > Build cover over sidewalk between house & laundry
- > Build cabinets in Kitchen
- > Install Light & Bell at front gate
- > Install facet outside laundry room
- > Move small buildings in rear of Home to the back fence line & install plumbing & elec. there are 5 small buildings that can be used to house groups or unwed mothers but they need to be moved and then hooked to utilities.
- > Build a playhouse
- > Landscaping planting grass, flowers and hedges at the fences for privacy
- > Build a carport
- > Build shelves in workshop
- > Build several closets
- > Build shelves in computer room > Build island in kitchen
